A reading from Jeremiah


¹These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. ⁴Thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: ⁵Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. ⁶Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. ⁶But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare. ⁶For thus says the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel: Do not let the prophets and the diviners who are among you deceive you, and do not listen to the dreams that they dream, ⁶for it is a lie that they are prophesying to you in my name; I did not send them, says the LORD.

¹⁰For thus says the LORD: Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place. ¹¹For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. ¹²Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. ¹³When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, ¹⁴I will let you find me, says the LORD, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you, says the LORD, and I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.

TRANSITION NOTES: WE'RE ON THE MOVE...!



With thanks for the helpful hands, hearts, and thoughtful minds of our staff and so many of our members - we continue to make good progress preparing to leave our buildings. A wonderful day of celebration and remembering is taking shape for September 11 worship (we will begin worshipping at St. Paul's on September 18). Specifics are under review for a Food Shelf operation prospect. And details too numerous to mention are being attended to!

Over the last three weeks we have also sought input on Call Committee candidates. While we received great recommendations, the Council emerged from its discernment this past Monday evening with the question: "Are we trying to move too quickly?" Historically, Calvary worship attendance is quite low during summer months so some of us may not even be aware of the invitation for recommendations. The Transition Team has been working hard to pull together a clear sense of the congregation for our Ministry Site Profile, but after these last two years of the pandemic many questions remain such as: "Who are we in terms of ministry focus moving forward? How many members remain engaged at Calvary? What will our financial picture look like on the other side of the property sale?" The Council united around slowing down the process of forming a Call Committee and keeping our immediate focus acutely attuned to settling into temporary worship and program space over the next two months and asked the Transition Team to consider this approach at its meeting held this past Tuesday. They wholeheartedly agreed. The two teams are planning to meet in October and review a revised timeline around the formation of a Call Committee. More information will be shared in coming weeks.

We are still working on getting additional information posted to the Calvary website and greatly appreciate all questions raised – please keep them coming, along with your thoughts and ideas to:
